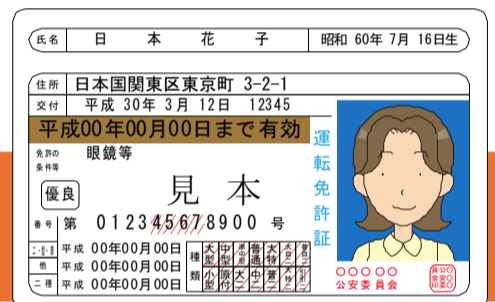

## When driving a vehicle in Japan...

### Type of Driver's Licenses/Permits

※ You need one of the above.



#### Japanese Driver's License

May drive until the date of expiration on the license

#### International Driving Permit pursuant to the Geneva Convention on Road Traffic

May NOT drive in Japan if:

- 1) one year passes from the day of your entry into Japan\*, or
- 2) your permit/license expires.

※ However, when individuals who registered into Basic Resident Register left Japan with confirmation or with permission and reentered Japan within 3 months, the reentry date would not be an initial date in reckoning for their eligibility for driving.

#### Foreign Driver's License issued by the authorities of nations or territories in the below note

Note :

- Applicable for licenses from 5 countries and 1 region including Switzerland, Germany, France, Belgium, Monaco, and Taiwan
- Proper Japanese translation of the driver's license produced by translators designated by cabinet order

### Rules you need to keep up before riding a bike

- ① Have Bicycle Insurance. ② Inspect and Maintain Your bicycle for Safety.
- ③ Install Reflectors. ④ Wear a Helmet. ⑤ No Drunk Cycling.

### Rules you need to keep up while you ride a bicycle

- ① Always on the left side of roadway.
- ② Pedestrians always have priority over cyclists.
- ③ No distractions such as holding an umbrella, holding a phone, listening to music while riding a bicycle.
- ④ Check your safety before entering an intersection.
- ⑤ Turn on the lights before getting dark.
